General Information

REGISTRATION: To enroll your child, please complete both sides of the registration form and return with payment (make checks payable to Lawrence Special Activities) to the Lawrence School office by Wednesday, November 13th at 2:40 pm to be included in the lottery. A separate form is required for each child. There are extra forms in the school office and available online.

When classes are oversubscribed students will be randomly selected by a computer lottery. If your child is not selected in the lottery, he/she will automatically be placed in the second choice class if that is available. If no alternate class is indicated, your money will be refunded. **LATE REGISTRATIONS WILL NOT BE INCLUDED IN THE LOTTERY.**

If you miss the registration deadline, we offer an open enrollment period on a first come basis until all classes are full. Letters confirming your child's class enrollment will be sent home in your child's backpack.

SCHOLARSHIPS: Families who qualify for the free or reduced lunch program may apply for scholarships. Scholarships are available for each eligible child enrolling in **ONE CLASS ONLY**. A minimum payment of 30% of tuition per course is required. Please indicate scholarship amount requested on registration form. If you have any questions about LSA's scholarship policy, please call Joanne Liautaud at 617-232-5690.

REFUNDS: If a class is cancelled due to under-enrollment, tuition will be refunded. **NO REFUND IS AVAILABLE TO STUDENTS ONCE CLASSES BEGIN.**

INSURANCE: All children must be covered by insurance in order to participate in the program. School insurance coverage is acceptable.

SCHOOL HOLIDAYS, VACATIONS AND EARLY RELEASE DAYS: Classes will not be held on these days.

DISMISSAL TIME: Parents should indicate on the registration form whether their child will go back to LEDP, be picked up after class by a parent or can walk home alone. Please remember that there are no crossing guards on duty for the LSA program. Parents are responsible for the safe transportation of their children to and from classes. Please pick your child up promptly. LSA is not responsible for children before or after class.

General Information (Continued)

CHILDREN IN LEDP: Children in LEDP must report to that program before going to an LSA class. Please note on the registration form which days your child is in LEDP. LEDP will give parents a consent form authorizing them to release children to LSA classes.

SNOW DAYS: LSA will not be held on Snow Days. We will do our best to make up any missed classes due to inclement weather at the end of the session.
